HISTORY

A munificent donation of five hundred thousand rupees made to the Shri Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha, Madras, by the Philanthropic Dwaraka Doss brothers, the late Shri Jumna Doss and the late Shri Amichand Doss enabled it to found the Dwaraka Doss Goverdhan Doss Vaishnav College, Madras, in June 1964. The phenomenal growth of this institution prompted the Sabha to think loudly of expanding its service to education at different levels. A Telugu businessman and great philanthropist, the late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty, came forward with a generous donation of four hundred thousand rupees including a 21-ground land adjoining the college, for starting a first grade English School with modern techniques of teaching, blended perfectly with Hindu ethos and culture. The active involvement of the Sabha and the munificence of Chettigaru together triggered the starting of Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav School on 3 July 1972 with the blessings of His Holiness 108 Goswami Shri Brijratnalji Maharaj. That day the school made a humble beginning by admitting students from LKG to V standard. Handsome donations given periodically by Shri Kola Perumal Chetty totalled to more than a million rupees. This and the untiring efforts of the managing body resulted in a three storey building within a year of its inception, paving way for the steady growth of the school over the years. In fact, the school came to be styled as Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav Senior Secondary School in 1978 with the opening of Plus Two, affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. Spacious class rooms, good furniture, well equipped laboratories, excellent playgrounds and other amenities have made this institution enviable and most sought after by the parents and students alike.

The school imparts instruction in English medium. Tamil and Hindi are taught from std. I onwards and Sanskrit and French from std. VI.

Realizing the difficulties of the tiny tots to reach the school, Shri Kola Perumal Chetty donated a school bus in 1974. Science and Library Block was constructed in 1977 to accommodate the laboratories, work shops and the library. The top floor of the main building was built in

1979. To facilitate the smooth functioning of the school activities, an Open Air Theatre was commissioned in 1982. The office functioning in the first floor of the new administrative block built in 1984 was shifted to the ground floor in 2004 together with the Principal's office and the Correspondent's room. The Principal's room on the first floor was converted into Committee Meeting room. It was Shri Kola Perumal Chetty who was instrumental in starting a course in Computers in 1985. In 1986 a spacious canteen was added to provide hygienic snacks and drinks to appease the palate of the pupils.

In 1994-95 a new building to house the book stall, canteen, Sanchayika Bank, NCC room, three class rooms and the Computer lab was built. In May 2002 a lift was installed. It was inaugurated during the Tri-Decennial celebrations. A new school bus was bought in July 2002. Provision for rain water harvesting was made, bus and cycle sheds were built and paver blocks laid round the compound.

In 2003 - 2004, the administrative office was shifted to the ground floor and new air-conditioned rooms were provided. A spacious Computer lab and Maths lab were built on the second floor.

In 2005, the ADC Auditorium was rebuilt with two green rooms, one classroom and an audio-visual room. The staff room was extended and separate cabin for each teacher was provided. An arch with the school name was built at the main entrance. The school prayer hall was extended and air conditioned in May 2007. It provides a perfect ambience for daily prayer. The school gained ISO 9001 : 2000 certification in April 2005. It was upgraded to ISO 9001 : 2008 in April 2009. In 2007, Smart Class Programme was introduced for all classes and Plasma T.V.s were installed in all classes. The Basket Ball court was relaid and two floors were added to the Audio-Visual Block in the year 2008. A roof garden was set up on the terrace of the computer block.

In 2009 the school Library and KG Block were renovated and air conditioners were provided.

As per the CBSE instructions, the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation Scheme was implemented in the year 2010-2011 for classes I to X to provide holistic education.

In the year 2010 the Primary classes I - IV were renovated with false ceiling and tiled flooring. New furniture was provided. Light Roofing facility opposite to the ADC auditorium was also constructed.

The Centenary Year Celebration (17.02.1911 - 17.02.2011) of our Founder Chairman Late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty was organized in a grand manner on 17.02.2011.

In the year 2011 classes V to VIII were renovated with tiled flooring, false ceiling and new set of furniture. Two air conditioners were fixed in std. XII-B.

The highlight of the 2011 - 2012 was the two day project exhibition 'Green Nature' with the theme - Perceive, Preserve and Protect the environment.

In the year 2012 classes IX-XI, Maths Lab, VCA room and Sanskrit room were renovated with false ceiling and tiled flooring.

A new E.B. Panel Board was installed on the ground floor in the year 2013 as a safety measure for effective and proper power supply. The parapet walls along the corridors of the first floor and the second floor were fitted with new railings as an effective safety measure.

To combat the problem of water stagnation during the rainy season and to provide relief, new drainage water channels were constructed with Gutters of Truss and down-taking pipe facility. The school also introduced Easy Educational Automation Software module.

In the year 2013 - 2014 std XII-B class room was renovated. Two air conditioners were installed each in std XII B class room and the prayer hall. Additional rest rooms were constructed in the I floor (for girls) and in the II floor (for boys).

Interactive Touch Smart Boards with Projectors were installed in Classes XI & XII and the KG block to make teaching - learning process more effective and enriching.

The school purchased two buses, 29 seater - Eicher & 49 seater - Ashok Leyland to provide easy and safe transport to the young students living at a distance from the school.

Fire alarms were installed in each floor as a safety measure.

The Kola Perumal Chetty Best Teacher Award was instituted in the academic year 2013-14 to perpetuate the memory of the Founder Chairman of the school late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty. The Maiden Kola Perumal Chetty Best Teacher Award function was hosted on Saturday, 29 March 2014.

The school introduced online registration for Pre KG in the academic year 2014-2015 to make the admission process easy and effective. No application forms are issued in the school campus. Our website : www.kpcvs.co.in.

The infrastructure of the school was upgraded in the academic year 2014-2015 to suit modern needs. As the strength increased, there was need for extra classrooms, therefore the following changes were made :

The committee meeting room was converted & renovated as XI A class room. The NCC room and book stall were converted into II C class room. A part of the library was converted into book stall and NCC master shares space in the I floor Hindi room in the AV Block. The craft room and UPS room in the first floor were renovated. A new computer lab was constructed in the second floor and the art room shared space with the Maths lab. New ACs were installed in XI A, XI B & XI C class rooms. ACs were also installed in X A & B rooms and II B & C rooms to combat the fumes of the adjacent car service centre.

Additional washbasins were fixed behind the library and a new rest room was constructed there.

The Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha donated a 12 seater, AC New Force Traveller to facilitate travelling.

In the year 2015-2016 additional sections were added in std III (III C) and in std XII (XII C).

All Plasma TVs were replaced with Interactive Touch Screen Boards. The school also purchased new furniture.

All classrooms are under the surveillance of CCTV Cameras as per the Tamilnadu Govt. instructions.

The Laying of the Foundation Stone Ceremony of the New KG block of the school was held on 9 March 2015. This project is a part of the Golden Jubilee Project of Shri Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha.

The construction of the NEW Golden Jubilee Block Phase-I was completed in a record time. It comprises of 12 class rooms, 3 staff rooms, 3 Language rooms, 11 toilets for students and 1 for the staff, a Prayer Hall, EB Panel Room and Lift facility.

The Golden Jubilee Block - Phase I was inaugurated on 22 October 2015 by His Holiness Goswami I08 Dhruvil Kumarji Mahoday of Surat.

All the KG classes were shifted to the New Block on 21-12-2015. All the teachers were provided coats by the Management, thus ushering in uniformity and uniqueness. In the academic year 2016-2017 a new section was added to each of the classes - Pre KG to std IV.

The school purchased new furniture (Dual Desk for students, tables and chairs for teachers) to the tune of 13 lakhs. The school acquired 45 new Airconditioners for installation in the new block phase II and classes IXA & B in the main building.

The **Golden Jubilee Celebration** of the Shree Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha was held in a grand manner at the **Centenary Hall**, Madras University on 23 July 2016. The chief guest was his Excellency Dr.K. Rosaiah - The Governor of Tamil Nadu. The Founder Patron of the V.V.Sabha, His Holiness I08 Shree Goswami Shree Mathureshwarji Maharajshree and H.H. Goswami I08 Shree Drumil Kumarji Mahoday graced the occasion.

His Holiness I08 Shree Goswami Shree Mathureshwarji Maharajshree unveiled the **Golden Jubilee Plaque and inaugurated the Modern A.D.C. Auditorium and Golden Jubilee Block Phase - II** on 24-7-2016 in the school premises. A Solar Panel costing about 21 lakhs, was dedicated by Goswami I08 Drumil Kumarji Mahoday.

Stala Shuddi Samskrana Pooja was performed on 19.09.2016 in the school premises. The consecration of Goddess Saraswathi and Lord Ganesha was performed on 5.10.2016 and Samprokshana (Prana Prathishta) of the Temple of Goddess Saraswathi was performed at the school campus on 6th October 2016.

Classes I-IV shifted to the new block on 2 November 2016. The new building also houses the spacious and well furnished Principal's room and the Administrative office.

SPECIAL FEATURES

1. **Intensive Academic Training** : Academic training starts on the very first day the school reopens. Slackness in studies and truancy from class work will be taken to the notice of parents or guardian as and when warranted. The cooperation of the parents/guardian is solicited in correcting their erring wards. The parents/guardian are advised to keep in touch with the Principal once a month. This collective effort of teachers, administrators and parents is what makes our school very special.
2. **Library** : Located in a spacious and imposing building, the library provides open access to a large collection of books acquired over the years. It has been remodelled with modern facilities - a separate cabin for the librarian, wall cupboards with glass doors, marbled floor, news bulletin boards, reading room for the staff and colourful plastic chairs for the students. It is fully airconditioned and provides perfect ambience for peaceful reading. The authorities encourage students to use the library to the maximum. The library is kept open after school hours and during term end holidays also.
3. **Sports and Games** : The school has Volley Ball and Badminton Courts. The students are encouraged to play Table Tennis, Tennis, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi etc. Facilities for athletics are plenty here. Drill and Physical Training are compulsory components of the curriculum. A new Basketball Court was constructed at a huge cost during the year 2001 and it was inaugurated in 2002.
4. **School Publications** : The school publishes a calendar and diary which gives all the information needed by the students and parents. The newsletter 'Bal Brindavan', highlights the school activities. The annual school magazine 'Brindavan' carries articles by students and staff. From time to time souvenirs are published to commemorate special / significant occasions of the school.
5. **Gita Class** : Bhagavad Gita classes are conducted for the students of std.V to XII every Thursday from 3.00 to 3.45 p.m. Students having cent percent attendance receive a scholarship of ₹.100/- and those having 99% attendance receive a scholarship of ₹.50/-

6. **Hindi Class :** Hindi classes are conducted for training the students for Dakshin Bharath Hindi Prachar Sabha Exams after school hours.
7. **Prayer :** The tone of the school is set by the Prayer which commences at 8.40 a.m. on all working days. An atmosphere of serenity prevails as the students recite slokas in praise of Lord Krishna. They invoke the blessings of Goddess Saraswathi and the Gurus. Slokas from the Gita and verses from Thirukkural also form a part of the daily prayer. This is followed by meditation which improves their mental alertness.
8. **Community Service :** The students are encouraged to actively participate in social and community work like Road Safety Patrol, Scouts & Guides, N.C.C., Cubs and Bulbuls. NCC (VIII & IX), RSP (XI), Guides (VI - IX), Scouts (VI & VII). Cubs & Bulbuls (III -V) classes are held four times per month to train students in right social behaviour, discipline, citizen ship, etc.
9. **Canteen :** Students can buy hygienic eatables from the canteen during the lunch break.
10. **Accident Cover :** A personal Accident Insurance Scheme is provided by M/s. Tata AIG Insurance for all students. This scheme was introduced during the academic year 2004-2005. Students (I to XII) pay a premium of ₹.150/- annually and become a member of this scheme. This is obligatory.
11. **Medical Facilities :** The school runs a first aid cell. Annual medical check-up, conducted by qualified doctors, is a must for every student.
12. **Parent Teacher Association :** Class wise PTA meetings are held monthly. But its executive body meets more frequently to discuss the issues connected with the school.
13. **Alumni Association :** The old students of the school are welcome to visit the school and join the annual get together on January 26. They have to get enrolled as life members on payment of ₹.100/
14. **Kalasarovar :** This Inter School Cultural Meet is biennial feature of the school. It is sponsored by well-wishers.

- 15. Summer Coaching Camp :** Encouraged by the overwhelming response and success of the Summer Coaching camp started in May `93, the school has made it a regular feature. This two week course stresses on physical fitness and gives coaching in games like Table Tennis, Badminton, Volleyball, Basketball, Cricket, Athletics, Chess, Carrom. Art and Craft classes are also conducted.
- 16. Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy :** To promote and nurture Indian art and culture and also to provide more opportunities to develop their innate talents and to impress upon young minds the significance of Indian heritage, values and virtues, art and culture, the Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy of the school conducts classes for the following disciplines - Vocal, Dance, Guitar, Violin, Veena, Mridangam, Tabla, Flute, Yoga and the Key Board.
- Students of classes V to VIII attend any one of the above disciplines. The classes are conducted on Mondays and Wednesdays from 2.20 p.m to 3.45 p.m.
- 17. Career Guidance :** There is a Career Guidance cell which arranges lectures by experts in different fields for the senior students.
- 18. Computer Classes :** Computer Science forms a part of the curriculum for classes I to X. The school has well - equipped computer labs. The school is hooked to Internet. The school has its own Website. Do visit us at www.kpcvs.in. You can also send your views to kolaperumal@gmail.com
- 19. Maths Lab :** In keeping with the CBSE's directive, a Maths Lab was set up in 2004-2005. The Lab has provisions for enriching the ability and creativity of the students.
- 20. Tour :** Travel helps to broaden one's outlook. To promote the all round development of the students of std. IX to XII, tours to places of historical, geographical, mythological and religious importance are arranged every year in lieu of their field trips. The Staff Council finalises the places and schedule during the academic year. The cost of the tour is collected in instalments with the term fees. Any student applying for T.C. in the middle of the academic year should pay the whole amount before clearance.
- 21. Indoor Games Hall :** A spacious hall is provided for the students to practise indoor games like Table Tennis, Carrom, Chess etc.

- 22. Sri Vallabha Sanskrit Vidya Pitham :** To propagate and keep alive our rich, ancient language, free classes are held in Sanskrit on all Sundays and second Saturdays to enable Sanskrit lovers to learn the language. Students are prepared to appear for the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Exams. The classes are open to all those who are willing to learn.
- 23. Art Education & Co-curricular Activities :** Literary Associations, Music, Arts & Crafts, Film Shows, Sports and Interact Club promote interesting co-curricular activities.
- 24. Smart Class - Visual Education :** BEAMS - A multimedia complex was built in December 2003. Visual education is provided through K-Yan, T.V., V.C.P. Film Projector and Smart Class. **Our school remains one of the pioneers in introducing the Interactive Touch Board.** These classes were introduced during the Academic Year 2007-08 from PreKG to std.XII. Such technology is helping in enhancing class room teaching and making teaching - learning process effective and interesting.
- 25. Scholarship for Gita Recitation :** The Management of the school will grant full fee concession to students who are able to recite from memory all the 18 chapters of the Gita.
- 26. Shri Vallabh Band Troupe :** To commemorate the Silver Jubilee year, the school formed the 'Shri Vallabha Band Troupe'. The students of std.V to VIII receive intensive training in playing the flute, trumpet, clarinet and drums. The training is given by experienced persons. In the year 2001 an Inter School Band Competition was introduced - the first of its kind. Three Rolling Shields for the first three places were instituted. This competition is a yearly feature.
- 27. Book Stall :** The school has a well equipped Book Stall which supplies books and stationery to the students as per their requirements. This is beneficial to both students and parents.
- 28. School Bus :** The school has 3 buses - a 28 seater - Eicher, 49 seater Ashokleyland and a 12 seater Force Traveller. The 12 seater Force Traveller was sold. A new 29 seater Eicher was purchased during January 2017 to provide easy and safe transport to the young students living at a distance from the school.

- 29. Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy :** The year 2003 saw the birth of the Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy. This academy works after school hours from 3.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. Budding sports persons are given intensive coaching in the games of their choice.
- 30. Health Club :** This club is taking great initiative in creating awareness among students about the need to maintain good health. Speeches, lectures, competitions and food festivals are organized at regular intervals.
- 31. Disaster Management Cell :** The school has a “Disaster Management Cell” to train students to cope up with disaster and lend a helping hand when the situation demands it.
- 32. Counselling Unit :** The school has a “Counselling Unit” which helps both students and parents to discuss problems faced by their wards and try to find solutions. Parents can meet the counsellor on Monday and Thursday evenings after school hours.
- 33. National Green Corps :** The school is a member of National Green Corps. The main objective of the NGC is to bring children into direct contact with environmental problems faced by the society they live in and make them think of solutions. NGC unit celebrates Van Mahotsav, Wildlife Week, International Ozone Day, Human Rights Day, World Day for Water, etc.
- 34. Roof Garden :** As per the guidance of the Confederation of Indian Industry, the school set up a beautiful Roof Garden in the year 2008. There are 428 varieties of plants which enhance the beauty of the surroundings.
- 35. In touch with Parents : The school is conveying messages to all parents through SMS.** This facility enables the parents to know the day to day activities of the school.
- 36. X - Seed :** A path breaking and new educational programme x-seed was introduced at the KG level in 2013-2014. The innovative and activity - oriented programme has been extended to classes I to IV. In 2017-18 it will be a part of the curriculum of class V.
- 37. French :** French, as a second language, was introduced in std VI in the year 2013-2014 due to its popularity and demand. The school offers French as a second language to interested students from classes VI to X.

- 38. Mental Math :** Mental Math refers to the practice of doing calculations mentally. Mental Math is an extremely common and practical skill. Students who practice it make calculations in their minds without the guidance of pencil and paper, calculators or other aids. It sharpens the mind, increases mental agility, improves memory and develops problem solving capability of students. Mental Math is part of the syllabus for classes I to V. It is being extended this academic year (2017-2018) to classes VI-VIII.
- 39. Vocational Course :** As per the CBSE guidelines, Vocational course was introduced in class IX in 2013 - 2014. Information Technology (IT) is the subject for the Vocational Course.
- 40. Report Bee :** Report Bee, an online software tool to generate Report cards was implemented in the Academic year 2013 - 2014. Parents can view the Report Card at the end of every Semester / Terminal Examination.
- 41. Heritage Club :** Heritage Club was inaugurated on 04.12.2013 for std VIII to familiarize the students with the rich cultural heritage of our country. The club conducts Quiz, debates & guest lectures regularly.
- 42. Health insurance Policy for Staff :** The Management Committee introduced Health Insurance Policy - United India Insurance Company Ltd. in the year 2013-14. All staff are benefitted by this scheme.
- 43. Scholarship :** The Management instituted scholarship for the needy and the deserving students in 2012 - 2013. Every year 12 students receive this scholarship.
- 44. Integrated Program :** SMART (Science & Mathematics Academy for the Real Talents) has been producing outstanding results in Olympiads, IIT - JEE, BITSAT & AIEEE over the years. The Management introduced Smart Classes in std XI in the academic year 2014 - 2015. This was extended to std. XII in the year 2015 -16.
- 45. Parent Involvement Cell :** The Parent Involvement Cell was launched in the year 2014 to expose the students to wider horizons of knowledge in different fields, to create wholesome personalities and churn out holistic individuals who will be an asset to our nation.

The school organizes lectures, presentations and discussions from time to time by distinguished parents who are professionals in various areas like Career Counselling, Personality Development, Personal Hygiene, Child Abuse etc.

46. **Bridge Course** was introduced in April 2015 for the students who had written the std X board examination. The main aim is to groom the students for the main subjects - Mathematics / Physics / Chemistry / Biology / Computer Science / Accountancy / Business Studies and Economics. The course also aims at making their transition smooth and easy and to equip students with the knowledge and the confidence needed to take on bigger challenges. This will be regular feature of the school.
47. **Yoga Classes** : Regular yoga practice can strengthen the body, calm the mind, regain the focus and improve self-confidence. Yoga classes were introduced for std IX - XII in the year 2015-2016.
48. **AIMS IIT - JEE Foundation Course** for std VI - IX was introduced in the academic year 2015-2016. Experienced academicians handle the classes for peak performance of students who have opted for the course.
49. **Get Well Room** : The school has a well equipped 'Get Well Room' in the new block. Children who fall ill are taken care of by a vigilant nurse.
50. **Homeopathy Dispensary** : A leading Homeopath Doctor has opened a dispensary in the school premises. Parents of the school can avail her services on all Fridays between 3.00 to 4.30 p.m. on cost to cost basis.
51. **Special Educator** : The school has appointed a Special Educator, a trained professional, who can handle the problems of children who have learning disabilities and help them to achieve their highest potential and assist them to progress beyond their limitations.

GENERAL RULES

1. The Parents are required to send the school diary without fail through their wards. They are free to communicate with the school through this book.
2. Parents are not permitted to meet the teachers directly. They may do so with the written permission from the Principal.
3. The school discourages private coaching. However the Principal may arrange such coaching in special cases.
4. Students suffering from contagious diseases like mumps or measles / chicken pox / swine flu, must stay away from school during the quarantine period (21 days).

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1. Behave in a responsible manner.
2. Consideration, courtesy and respect should be shown at all times.
3. Everyone should always try to understand other people's point of view.
4. Make it as easy as possible for everyone to learn and for the teacher to teach, whether this takes place inside or outside the classroom.
5. Always show friendship, kindness and care to others.
6. Speak politely to each other and all adults.
7. The school should be kept clean and tidy so that it can be a welcoming place.
8. Have respect for other people and their possessions.
9. Remember that the school's reputation depends on the way one behaves.
10. Be punctual and regular.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

1. Students are strictly forbidden to loiter in the verandahs.
2. Smoking, consuming drugs, littering, defacing the walls, ragging, use of offensive language and such other uncivilized behaviour will not be tolerated.
3. Students are not allowed to address any authority in a body, as such combined action is not conducive to good order.
4. Consumption of non-vegetarian food in the campus is strictly forbidden.
5. Coming late to the school is a serious breach of discipline. Such late comers are likely to be sent home. If this recurs, the student is imposed a fine of 5/-
6. Slackness in attendance, habitual late coming, indifference to home work, disobedience and disrespect towards staff and such other offences entail dismissal from the school.
7. Electronic gadgets like mobile phones, Ipads, Ipods, Smart watches. Android Tablets and Xbox etc. should not be brought to school. If a student is found possessing any one of these gadgets, it will be confiscated and returned only at the end of the academic year.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE RULES

1. Attendance is taken every session (morning and afternoon) by the class teacher. It is obligatory on the part of the student to attend all the periods prescribed for the day.
2. A student is required to attend the school on all the working days. If it becomes necessary to take leave, he/she has to submit a leave letter to the class teacher before availing the leave. If the student cannot submit the leave letter for genuine reasons before going on leave, he/she may do so on return to the school.
3. Students abstaining from school for more than three days have to submit an explanatory letter written by the parent / guardian.
4. Leave on medical grounds should be supported by a proper medical certificate.
5. The school monitors the student's attendance periodically. Parents / Guardian are informed if their wards lag behind in attendance. They are requested to take corrective steps in such cases.

HOUSE SYSTEM

“Teach them young”, goes the adage. In order to develop leadership qualities and shape their personalities, the students from std. I - XII are divided into four houses. Raman, Shivaji, Tagore and Vivekananda, with house colours : green, blue, red and yellow. Each house guided by able teachers, forms a cohesive group but vies with the others in winning laurels.

Each house, in turn, is assigned a week-long responsibility of conducting the morning assembly, preparation of news reports, talks on spiritual and general topics, pulling up late-comers and those that flout uniform regulations, ensuring discipline, smooth movement of students to their class rooms, checking furniture, maintenance of black boards, conducting school functions and overall supervision of any activity that is connected with the school. Besides, a contemporary theme is also highlighted every week through charts, posters, talks etc.

The competitive spirit among the houses is keen but healthy. The performance of each house is assessed and points are awarded. The best house gets the Rolling Shield.

ADMISSION

1. The school is co-educational, admitting both boys and girls to all standards without consideration of caste, creed, community or social status.
2. The students seeking admission can collect the registration form from the school office. Such forms, filled in by the parents/ guardians, must be submitted for registration together with the necessary certificates before the due date.
3. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Principal can refuse admission to an applicant without assigning any reason whatsoever.
4. Applicants from recognised schools must produce the following :
 - i) Transfer Certificate
 - ii) Conduct Certificate
 - iii) Mark List of the Qualifying Examination passed

- iv) Community Certificate
- v) Aadhaar Copy
- vi) EMIS (Educational Management Information System) No.

These certificates must be countersigned by the Inspector of schools if they have been issued by schools situated in states other than Tamilnadu. Students of CBSE schools should get the counter signature of the CBSE Dy. Secy. Chennai. in their TC's.

- 5. A student opting any of the 4 languages viz, Hindi / Tamil / Sanskrit/ French in std. IX should have studied the same upto std.VIII.

ADMISSION (XI Standard)

- 1. Candidates seeking admission into std XI must have passed the std X All India Secondary School Examination or Matriculation of Statutory Universities or the SSC Examination of any State Board of Secondary Education.
- 2. The candidates must have undergone 10 years of formal education in an English Medium School to become eligible for admission.
- 3. Minimum age prescribed for admission to the std XI is 15 years 6 months as on first June of the year in which admission is sought. This may be relaxed in special cases by the Chairman, CBSE, New Delhi.
- 4. Those seeking Science group must have secured 60% mark in Science and Maths and those seeking Commerce group must have secured 50% besides opting for English as a core subject.
- 5. The selected candidates should produce the following certificates in original at the time of admission.
 - i. Transfer Certificate
 - ii. Conduct Certificate
 - iii. Mark List of the last Examination passed i.e. std X.
 - iv. Pass Certificate from the Board / University.
 - v. Community Certificate.
 - vi. Aadhaar copy
 - vii. EMIS No.

SCHOOL FEES

1. Fees will be collected twice a year.
2. After the final selection of candidates, the parents have to remit the fee as per the fee challan and obtain the receipt for the same (only for new admissions) in the extension counter of Karur Vysya Bank situated in the school campus.
3. A separate counter will be opened by Karur Vysya Bank in the school campus during the below mentioned dates and the fee can be paid in the school campus itself. The fee challan will be issued after the announcement of the results. **This fee challan should be preserved carefully for the whole academic year.**
